

Bali to Labuanbajo 10 Nights (Komodo)

Length of trip - 11 Days / 10 Nights

Dives - Approximately 28 dives in total

Experience level required - Open Water - No minimum logged dives required.

Bali to Komodo National Park

10 Night Itinerary

The boat embarks from Benoa Harbour in Bali, sailing North-East towards Tulamben, Bali where guests can dive the famous USS Liberty Wreck, Seraya and Drop Off before sailing East covering Moyo and Satonda Island, Bima Bay, Sangeang Volcano, Banta Island and the whole of Komodo National Park.

The boat will disembark in Labuan Bajo, Flores.

There will also be hiking in Gili Lawa Darat and also the walk on Rinca Island to see the Komodo Dragons.

On the way from Satonda Island, thousands of fruit bats can be seen in the evening.

Highlights of the itinerary:

USS Liberty Wreck, abundance and diverse in soft corals, schooling jacks, oceanic white tip sharks, underwater bubbles from Sangeang Volcano, excellent macro life, octopus, manta rays, eagle rays, occasional Molas in Manta Alley, the Komodo Dragon Walk, fruit bats from Satonda Island.

After the last dive of the trip, guests may go ashore to see the Komodo Dragons while guided by the park rangers at either Komodo Island or Rinca Island. Dragon Walk, as it's called includes a short walk with an introduction by the guide about the National Park and Komodo Dragons where guests will see them in the wild. Staff members will accompany the group.

The exact route and sites visited are subject to change based on local regulations, guest experience, weather and logistics, and is at the Captain's discretion.

Komodo diving liveboard trips offer different distinct itineraries, and each have been scheduled during the best time of year to dive there.

The 7, 10 and 11 night liveboard Komodo cruises feature enhanced vacation itineraries that allows guests more time diving and more time in the signature areas.

Each itinerary departs from a different island/port.

Guests are encouraged to arrive at least one day prior to the charter start date regardless of the trip you are on.

The yacht offers 3 to 4 dives per day depending on itinerary including night dives.

Depth Range: 30 – 100 ft (9m – 30m)

Water temperatures can vary greatly within the park.

- low of 72F/22C in the southern region

- high of 84F/29C in the northern region.

3-5mm wetsuit with hood is recommended year round.

Guests are also suggested to bring reef hooks for use at some dive spots

All diving is done from two 20' x 8' tenders.

BOARDING - YACHT DEPARTURE/CHECK OUT TIMES

Komodo: Embarks 1 pm - 5 pm and disembarks 7 am – 9 am

The yacht departs the port after everyone is onboard on the charter departure date. All guests are advised to arrive to the departure destination with plenty of time to transfer to the yacht.

The Indo Aggressor aims to return to port on the evening prior to disembarkation.

Final disembarkation will occur between 7:00 am –9:00 am at the end of the charter.

DIVING CONDITIONS

Any time of the year this area of Indonesia offers good diving.

Visibility may vary from season to season but 10 to 30 meters (35 to 100 ft.) can be expected at most dive sites.

Water temperatures can vary greatly within the park ranging from a low of 72F (22C) in the south to a high of 84F (29C) in the northern region. A 3-5mm wetsuit with hood is recommended year round.

All diving is from tenders.

Guests are also suggested to bring reef hooks for use at some dive spots.
