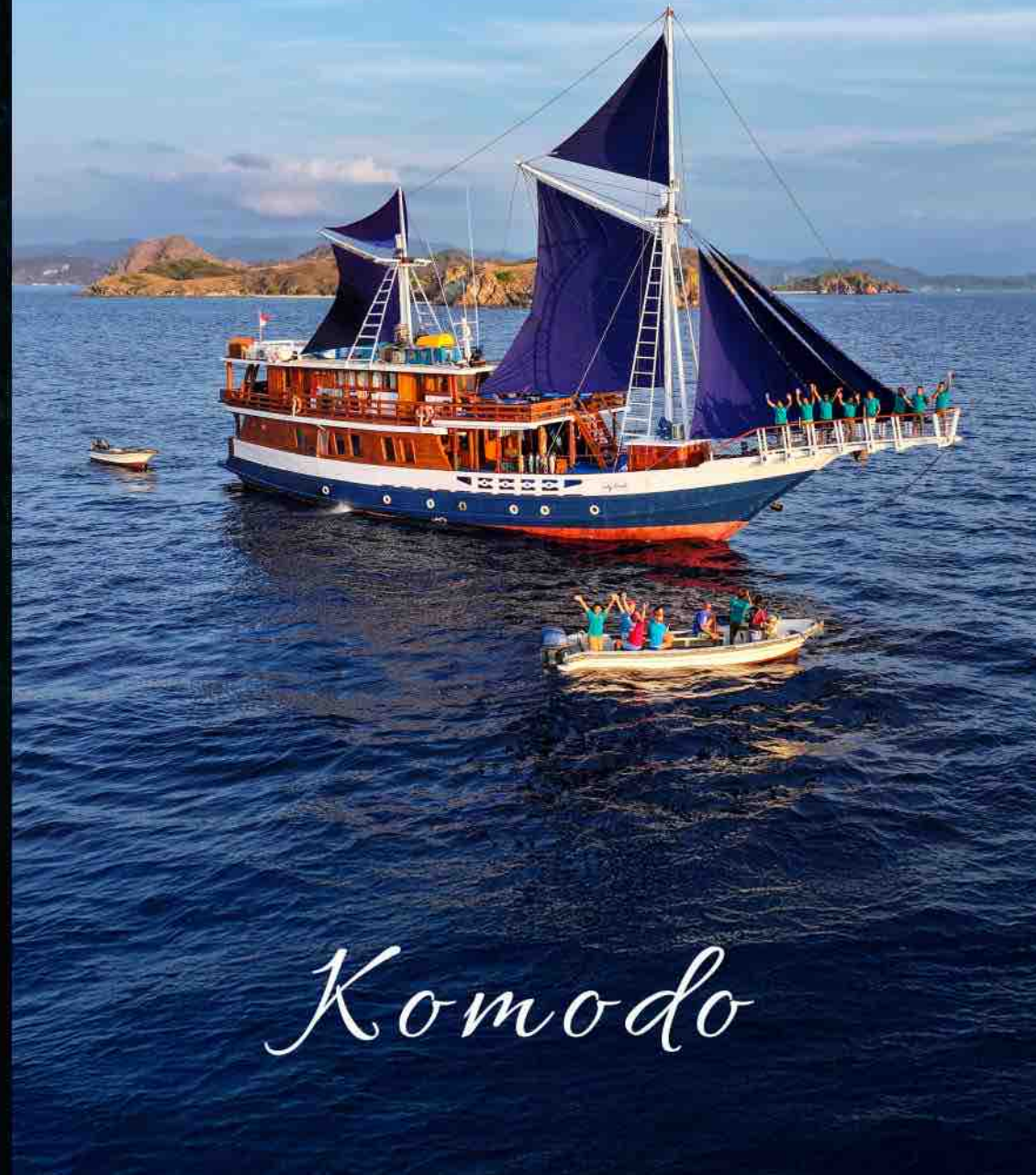


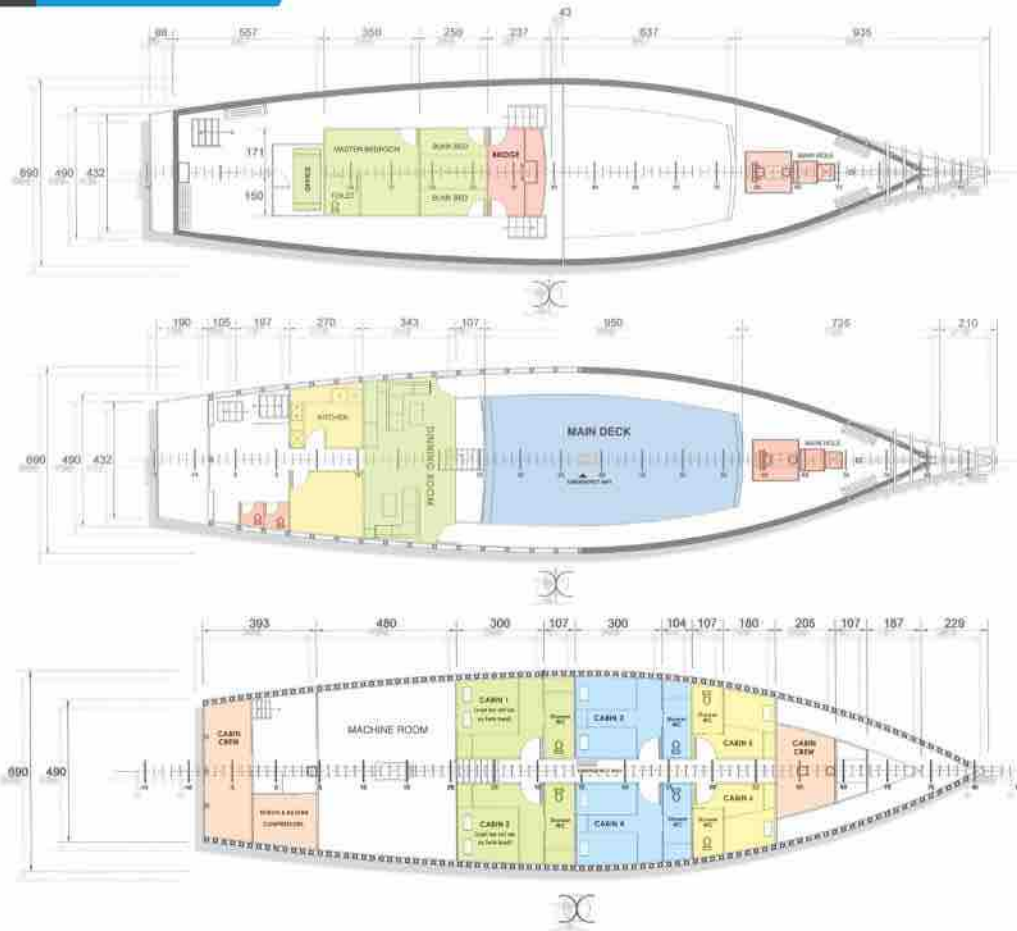

ACTIVITY

- **Activities at the Lady Denok liveaboard**

In addition to diving, we provide various activities during the trip, depending on the weather conditions and the final itinerary.

- **Snorkeling**

If you don't dive, you can still explore vibrant marine life in some of the best locations.

- **Kayaking and Paddleboarding**

We have two kayaks and two paddleboards available for use when the boat is anchored. Feel free to explore the shore or lagoons with them. Just remember that all activities are subject to weather conditions and the daily schedule.

- **Trekking**

As an alternative to diving, we offer trekking opportunities to explore the surrounding areas during dive breaks. In Komodo, guests can trek on Piaynemo Island or Wayag Island to see the famous lagoon. Additionally, you can trek on Love Lake to take in the breathtaking landscapes and visit Yenbuba Island.

- **Spending Time on Deck**

Relax on the deck, soak up the sun, or enjoy the stunning views.

- **Daily diving activities onboard typically include**

At 06:00 : wake up call
At 06:30 : light breakfast
At 07:00 : first dive
At 08:30 : warm breakfast
At 10:30 : second dive
At 12:00 : lunch time
At 14:30 : third dive
At 16:00 : snack time
At 18:00 : night dive (depending on the itinerary)
At 20:00 : dinner

- **Diving Briefings**

Each day starts with a briefing to discuss dive sites, safety protocols, and marine life expectations.

- **Guided Dives**

Enjoy multiple guided dive sessions in various locations, tailored to different skill levels.

- **Dive Equipment Check**

Crew members assist with checking and preparing dive equipment prior to each dive.

- **Surface Intervals**

Relax between dives with refreshments and snacks, and enjoy discussions about the underwater experiences.

- **Post-Dive Recap**

Share highlights of the dives with fellow guests and crew, along with photos if available.

- **Night Dives**

Depending on the itinerary, night diving may also be offered for a unique experience of nocturnal marine life.

- **Notes**

All activities are subject to weather conditions and the day's schedule. Dive into an unforgettable underwater adventure!



→ DIVE ORGANIZATIONS

- Before the trip, all guests must complete an enrollment form to outline their needs. This includes their flight details, requests for rental dive equipment, dietary preferences, and any allergies. This information allows our onboard team to make the necessary preparations in advance, including arranging airport pickups for those arriving on the same day as embarkation. Please be informed that some dive equipment is available for rent onboard. However, not all sizes may be available, so we recommend booking your equipment in advance of the cruise.
- Our dives are conducted as non-decompression recreational activities, with a maximum depth of 35 meters. Additionally, a safety stop is required at the end of each dive.
- Our crew will prepare a dive box for each diver, containing all the essential dive equipment. The first dive will be a check dive, during which our dive masters will assess each diver's skills and comfort level in the water. We will also organize the diving groups according to their experience levels, interests, and safety needs.
- Prior to each dive, the Cruise Manager will conduct a briefing to outline the site's topography, depths, currents, and potential hazards, as well as the marine life we anticipate encountering.
- The crew will transport your tank and dive equipment between Lady Denok and the dinghies. In the dinghies, the tanks are secured in designated slots, and the guide will assist you in gearing up right before you perform the back roll into the water.
- Books about reef and coral fish are available onboard. Our dive guides are also happy to assist you in identifying any marine animals you encounter during your dives.
- Some dive equipment are available for rent on board. However, all sizes are not necessarily available, so please book it prior to the cruise.
- Our cruises are open to divers with a PADI Advanced Open Water certification or its equivalent, provided they have a minimum of 30 logged dives. Less experienced divers are also welcome to participate, but special supervision must be arranged prior to the cruise.
- Insurance covering medical evacuation and diving accidents is highly recommended.



→ WEATHER



The weather in Komodo National Park is generally warm and tropical year-round, characterized by a dry season from April to December, when temperatures range from 25°C to 35°C (77°F to 95°F) and conditions are sunny and dry, ideal for outdoor activities such as diving and hiking. In contrast, the wet season, from January to March, brings increased rainfall and humidity, with temperatures typically between 24°C to 33°C (75°F to 91°F); although it usually doesn't rain all day, some areas may be less accessible due to weather conditions.

→ VISIBILITY



The waters of Komodo are teeming with marine life, which can sometimes affect visibility. Generally, visibility ranges between 10 to 30 meters, but this can fluctuate based on local conditions that may differ from one dive site to another.

→ TEMPERATURE



The water temperature in Komodo National Park varies by location and season. In the north, the water temperature is warmer, reaching highs of 30°C (86°F); while in the south, it can be as low as 20°C (68°F).

→ CURRENTS



Komodo National Park is famous for its strong, dependable currents that support a rich variety of marine life. With extensive experience exploring these dive sites, Lady Denok cruises prioritizes safety by carefully selecting optimal locations and timing to navigate currents effectively. Before every dive, our guides perform current assessments to ensure that our briefings provide you with the latest conditions.

• DAY 1 | 2X DIVES

After being welcomed aboard The Lady Denok by our crew, we'll set sail to our first destination, Sebayur Island, where we'll do check dive and possible night dive.

• DAY 2 | 4X DIVES

Enjoy a day of exploring the dive sites around Batu Bolong, Manta Point, Tatawa Besar, and Gili Lawa Bay. Batu Bolong features strong currents, making it ideal for experienced divers, and boasts a rich biodiversity that includes turtles and reef sharks. Manta Point is renowned for its manta ray sightings and also has variable currents. In Tatawa Besar, currents typically range from mild to moderate, making the site suitable for divers with some experience. Similarly, Gili Lawa Bay generally experiences moderate currents, but the bay is known for stronger currents during certain tidal conditions, which makes it best suited for experienced divers.

• DAY 3 | 3X DIVES

We will explore the dive sites of Crystal Rock, Castle Rock, and The Cauldron, where there's a chance to encounter a wide variety of marine life, including reef tip sharks, manta rays, pyramid butterflyfish, Napoleon wrasse, sweetlips, schools of barracuda, trevally, and possibly even dolphins! Castle Rock features strong currents, making it best for experienced divers, and it attracts pelagic species like barracudas and manta rays. Crystal Rock showcases beautiful coral formations and diverse marine life, making it suitable for divers with some experience. Meanwhile, The Cauldron offers dramatic underwater landscapes and also has strong currents, drawing in experienced divers eager to see marine life, including reef sharks.

• DAY 4 | 3X DIVES

We will spend the day exploring the waters around Padar Island, starting with a dive at the 3 Sisters spot, and then moving on to The Secret Garden and Pillar Steen, where you can discover beautiful coral gardens, little caves, and a sloping reef teeming with colorful reef fish and other marine life. The currents at these locations can vary, providing different diving experiences. At the 3 Sisters, currents are typically moderate, making it suitable for divers with some experience, while the changing currents add excitement and attract diverse marine life. The Secret Garden generally features mild to moderate currents, allowing for a more relaxed dive experience that is accessible to divers of varying skill levels, with opportunities to see a rich array of corals and marine species. Similarly, Pillar Steen usually has moderate currents, making it best suited for more experienced divers.

• DAY 5 | 4X DIVES

Diving in South Rinca Island offers an exciting underwater experience with rich marine biodiversity. In the morning, we will complete two dives at Cannibal Rock, which is famous for its vibrant coral reefs and abundant marine life, including colorful fish, turtles, and possibly larger pelagic species. This site typically features mild to moderate currents, suitable for divers of varying skill levels. In the afternoon, we will dive at Yellow Wall and Torpedo Point. Yellow Wall is known for its stunning overhangs and walls adorned with soft corals, providing ample opportunities to see a variety of marine life. Torpedo Point, on the other hand, often attracts unique species such as torpedo rays and offers a mix of hard and soft corals, making it a great spot for experienced divers. Together, these dive sites make for an unforgettable day of exploration in the waters surrounding South Rinca Island.

• DAY 6 | 4X DIVES

Diving at Manta Alley, south of Komodo Island, is an exciting experience known for frequent sightings of majestic manta rays. The currents are usually moderate, making it suitable for experienced divers. In the afternoon, we'll dive at Tanjung Sera, which features vibrant coral reefs and a variety of marine life, including colorful fish and larger species. As night approaches, we'll go for a night dive at Loh Sera, where we can see nocturnal marine life that becomes active in the dark. This combination of dives offers a memorable adventure in the beautiful waters of Komodo National Park.

• DAY 7 | 2X DIVES

Diving at Pink Beach offers a fantastic experience, known for its stunning pink sands and rich marine life. We will dive at Pink Rock, where you'll find vibrant coral reefs and a variety of colorful fish. Alternatively, we can explore Wae Nilu or Pengah Kecil, both known for their beautiful underwater scenery and diverse marine species. After diving, we'll have the opportunity to "meet" the impressive Komodo dragons on either Komodo Island or Rinca Island. Once we are ready, we will head to Kalong Island, where we can relax and enjoy the beautiful surroundings.

• DAY 8

Departure day. After breakfast, we'll head back to Labuan Bajo. Transfer to hotel or airport. Thank you for joining our Komodo trip and see you again in the next trip.

• NOTES

This is a sample itinerary and subject to change depending on weather, sea and unexpected conditions. There are over 60 dive sites in Komodo National Park and we're happy to consider guest preferences. Snorkeling is also an option at many of these sites, just ask the Cruise Manager for advice.

→ OUR FOOD

We offer a la carte or buffet-style meals featuring Western, Indonesian, Asian, and vegetarian options. Our daily menu includes a wide variety of dishes, with our Chef preparing cold breakfast, warm breakfast, lunch, snacks, and dinner for our guests each day. - **Will your crew pick me up when I arrive in the designated cities?**

Yes, our crew members, wearing Lady Denok uniforms, will meet you at the airport or at your nearby hotel on the day of embarkation.

- **What time the boat embarks from harbour?**

The boat will embark by 1:00 PM, or earlier if all guests have checked in before that time.

- **How many cabins do you have in Lady Denok Liveaboard?**

We have 7 cabins available for a total of 12 guests, including 1 Master Bedroom cabin, 2 Twin/Double bed cabins, 2 Twin bed cabins, and 2 Single bed cabins. Each cabin features an en-suite bathroom/toilet, with both warm and cold water, and air conditioning.

- **Do you provide amenities for each cabin?**

We provide towels, shampoo, and soap for each guest. Additionally, beach towels are available on the deck. A hair dryer can be provided upon request.

- **Do you have a camera room?**

We have a designated room for charging cameras and other devices.

- **How many dives in a day?**

Typically, there are 3 to 4 dives scheduled, except on the first and penultimate day, which are limited to a maximum of 2 dives each.

- **Do you impose a conditional minimum number of dives to join your trips?**

Guests are required to have at least Open Water licenses. For the Raja Ampat trip, we expect participants to have completed at least 30 dives, while for the Komodo trip, a minimum of 50 dives is required. We will assess your diving experience based on the enrollment form you submitted and the check dive on the first day of the trip, allowing our dive guide to place you in the most suitable group.

- **Is nitrox available?**

Nitrox is available; simply present your Nitrox license to our Cruise Manager. The cost for all-day diving with Nitrox is USD 15, while a la carte diving is USD 6 per tank.

- **Do you have a 15 ltr tanks? How much it costs per day?**

Yes, we do have them available, but in limited quantities. The cost is USD 10 per day.

- **What is the ratio of dive guides to divers on board?**

There is 1 dive guide for a maximum of 4 divers.

- **Is diving gear included in your trip? Can I rent diving equipment from your boat?**

For diving trip, we provide 12 liter tanks with air, weight, and belt. Other equipment is available for rent, for more information and details of price, please visit tab Gear Rental at: <https://www.ladydenokliveaboard.com/schedule-rates>. Please let us know in advance if you require rentals, and we will arrange it for you.

- **Can snorkelers participate in the Lady Denok trips?**

Absolutely. Snorkelers will be accompanied by one of the crew members as a guide, and a speedboat will always follow closely.

- **Is internet access available on board, and what is the cost?**

We offer Starlink internet service, and guests are welcome to use it free of charge whenever the Starlink signal is available.

- **How is the standard voltage and electricity in your boat?**

- **What kind of power plugs do you use in your boat?**

The standard voltage in Indonesia is 220–240 V. The power plugs and sockets on our boat accommodate type 2-pin sockets, which are the standard European plug design.

- **Can I charge devices using the electrical outlets in my cabin as well?**

There is a designated charging area on board, so it's not recommended to charge devices using the electrical outlets in the guest cabins.

- **Are you able to accommodate special diets, such as vegan and gluten-free options?**

Yes, we can accommodate those needs. Please let us know about your dietary preferences before boarding so we have enough time to prepare the necessary ingredients.

- **What daily activities can I expect during the trip on your boat?**

Daily activities on the boat start with a cold breakfast at 6:30 AM, followed by the first dive. A warm breakfast is served at 8:30 AM. The second dive takes place around 11:00 AM, after which lunch is served. The third dive occurs at 3:00 PM, followed by tea or coffee accompanied by sweet and savory treats. If there is a night dive, it typically begins between 6:00 PM and 7:00 PM, with dinner served afterward. Island visits are also possible, depending on the itinerary, requests, and conditions.

- **Can guests check in on the boat a day prior to the trip's start?**

Our crew will be busy preparing logistics and the boat itself before embarkation day, so it is not possible for guests to board the boat the day before the trip starts.

- **When is the final dive before check-out time?**

The last dive is scheduled for the penultimate day, and at least 18 hours before your flight.

- **What time is check-out?**

Check-out occurs after breakfast on the final day of the trip. We will take you to the airport or a nearby hotel.

- **What is the policy regarding tipping?**

Tipping in Indonesia is completely optional. If you feel that your trip met or exceeded your expectations, you may want to leave a tip. The recommended industry standard is between 5–10% of the total trip cost, but any amount you choose to give is greatly appreciated by the crew. Tips will be equally distributed by the Captain among all crew members.

- Your passport validity must be at least 6 months
- Before the trip, please fill in the Release of Liability form and Enrollment form provided by us, along with a photocopy of your passport (as required by the Indonesian government for clearance to sail) and your diving license. Kindly submit these at least 2 weeks prior to the trip.
- We will provide transfers from the airport or hotel to the boat on embarkation day, with pick-up services from hotels scheduled for 10 AM.
- On disembarkation day, we will transfer you to the airport or the nearest hotel after breakfast.

→ USEFUL INFORMATION

- All extras are payable in cash onboard (IDR, USD, Euro) or by credit card (Visa, Mastercard, JCB)
- Provided onboard: room towels, beach towels soap, and shampoo. Towels and bed sheets are replaced every 3 days.
- Hair dryer is available upon request
- Laundry cost USD 1.00/item and laundry day is every 3-4 days of the cruise
